- Key Strategic Orientations (KSOs): strategic goals in the EC policy priorities where R&I can make a substantial contribution
- Expected impacts: Impact through R&I results on society, including the environment, economy and science
- Destinations: "Packages of actions" in the Work programs to reach the Expected Impacts
- Calls for proposals: each destination will be implemented through Calls for proposals

MULTI-ACTOR APPROACH (MAA) Develop innovative solutions for practical challenges

- projects must focus on real problems or opportunities that farmers, foresters or others who need a solution ("end-users") are facing.
- partners with complementary types of knowledge – scientific, practical and other – must join forces in the project activities from beginning to end.
- MAA projects are able to develop innovative solutions which are more ready to be applied in practice and cover real needs.
- Those benefiting directly from the results of the projects will be more motivated to use them, because they were involved in generating them.

EXAMPLE OF A MULTIACTOR APPROACH PROJECT

The MyToolBox project will **develop, test and validate an entire toolkit** to effectively monitor and reduce the incidence of mycotoxin contaminants in crop production as well as in the food and feed supply chains. MyToolBox mobilises a **multi-actor and multi-disciplinary partnership throughout the food and feed chain** (with more than 40% industry participation including 5 end users and Chinese institutions who collaborate closely with farmers and other relevant stakeholders from the industry.

......will develop novel interventions aimed at achieving an increased volume of safe food and feed in the EU by a reduction in crop losses

THEMATIC NETWORKS Compiling knowledge ready for

- work on a specific theme.
- bring people from both science and practice together to create useful, practical outputs.
- focus existing scientific knowledge and best practices which are close to being put into practice, but not yet sufficiently ready for farmers and foresters to implement.
- translate this knowledge into easily understandable end-user material such as short, informative recommendations and solutions

- Any legal entity, regardless of its place of establishment, including legal entities from nonassociated third countries or international organisations may participate in actions
- Entities shall be part of a consortium that shall include at least three independent legal entities each established in a different Member State or associated country and with at least one of them established in a Member State
- Exception: Coordination and Support Actions (CSA = a special project type) may be implemented by one or more legal entities
- Who receives funding? only Member States or Associated countries, others only in exceptional cases




MENTIMETER WORD CLOUD


